Since we have so many active retirees in our congregations, we are hoping that these events, plus others that are being planned by church members at Atlantic will draw more people into the life of the church. It's all a work in progress, so keep praying and thinking about what God might have in store for all of us.

STEWARDSHIP MESSAGE Finding Joy

When you think about it, the Bible never really tells you how to be happy. It just encourages you to be joyful. Contentment and joy go hand in hand because they're both based on gratitude. Comparisons crush joy! Joyful people aren't jealous ("I want what

you have!") or envious ("I can't have it, so you shouldn't either!"). And while they may not have the best of everything, content folks make the best of everything. That's the starting point for joy.

Joyful people understand the truth of Psalm 24:1: "The earth is the Lord's, and fullness thereof." They know God owns it all and that they are stewards of His good gifts. Trusting Him to meet their needs eases the stress that can steal joy. If they get that right, they know everything else will fall into place.

That's why joyful people see themselves through God's eyes. They just serve an audience of one. One way to serve him is to forgive. Forgiveness leads to pure joy because we are never more like Jesus than when we forgive others—and ourselves (Ephesians 4:32).

Joyful people are givers. But they don't just give their money. In fact, for many joyful people, investing their time and talents is more fulfilling than sharing their treasure. The Bible says, "A joyful heart is good medicine, but a crushed spirit dries up the bones" (Proverbs 17:22). If you're feeling a little dry these days, shower yourself in the joy that only God can provide. It's good for what ails you. *Stewardship Committee*
