HERE'S WHAT'S HAPPENING April, 2018

Friends in Christ,

I recently had the opportunity to understand personally what it means to listen to Jesus. Preaching the series of this title and hearing about those who knew and responded to Jesus in scripture, I became more aware of the need to do this as a daily routine.

A few weeks ago, on a routine Tuesday as I rounded a corner near home, a car strayed from its lane coming directly into mine. For a split second, I was sure we were going to hit head on. I swerved to avoid it and wound up in a ditch. Once in the ditch, I realized I was headed for a brick wall. I believe in my panicked state there was one lucid moment where I heard a voice in my head say, "break gently". I listened, gently put my foot on the break, and avoided hitting just before impact. When the car stopped, I was shaken but unharmed. I thanked God for being with me since I am convinced the voice I heard was God's. At that point no one else was in sight. The other driver was long gone. I had a moment to be deeply grateful that I listened to the "still small voice" inside my head.

Having lucid/calm moments in the midst of daily struggles is a gift that I attribute to God and God's grace. It's the lucid moments that keep us steady and moving forward. It's the lucid moments that can keep us from harm, and from harming others with our words and actions. The season of Lent prepares us for troubling times. It causes us to take time out to reflect on God's provision, and to listen for God's voice. Through practicing the presence of God during the calm times, we are ready to depend on God when life throws curve balls at us.

Easter is a glorious season for Christians! We celebrate God with Us – God who loves us and walks with us in our troubles. As the old hymn goes, "there are some things I may not know, there are some places I can't go, but I am sure of this one thing, that God is real for I can feel God deep within" (Kenneth Morris, Yes, God is Real). God's Easter people proclaim – Christ is risen! Christ is risen indeed! May this teaching of our faith be real for you. May it provide a sense of assurance as you continue your journey in faith. The CURE group organized the Your Neighbor's Religion series to build bridges of understanding among people who may not know much about each other. Though all sessions were well attended and meaningful, the final session at the Delmarva Islamic Society in Salisbury was especially uplifting. Members of the society were very welcoming. Their religious teacher or *Imam* taught us about *The Five*

Pillars of Islam, which include offering peace to others, visiting people when they are sick and helping people when they are in need. We heard that several women of the mosque work behind the scenes to keep things going, for example, calling a plumber when needed and making sure there are snacks for fellowship. Not so different from what many women do in our churches! To honor their traditions, we removed our shoes and women wore head coverings. After the presentation, participants were invited to ask questions and meaningful dialogue took place. The members of the society thanked us for taking the time to attend. It was a blessed evening. 

Thrift Shop

In mid-March we successfully had our semi-annual Bag Sale and Shop Turnover. We were thrilled that about 30 people helped with various aspects of the weeks activities and we have a great start to the Spring season. Many thanks to everyone who helped and to the 43 people who have signed up to work various shifts at the shop. The greatest blessing that we have seen so far is that everyone seems to be having fun, working in the shop, and that's really what this is about.

Cold Weather Shelter

The exceptionally cold and dreary winter has caused the Shelter to be open an excessive number of nights. Luckily resources and volunteers have been available to open the shelter when needed. This year we have seen as many as 22 guests come to the shelter for protection. This has far exceeded our normal 10-12 guests and has certainly tested everyone. But God provides so the shelter has been there when needed. Our thanks to those Atlantic UMC members who have contributed in any way to this year's success.

Fellowship Connection

Our next activity is the June 7th Sight-and-Sound Bus Trip to see the show "Jesus". We have received some feedback that this may be the best production ever at this theater. We are accepting reservations for the trip via a signup board in the Fellowship Hall. The cost for the trip is \$113 per person which includes the bus, a stop at Kitchen Kettle, lunch at Hershey Farms Restaurant and the show. It is a great day so sign up soon. Spring Clean-up Update

Thanks for helping clean-up and organize storage areas around the church. Removal of items on the top shelves in the double door closet was necessary to comply with fire code regulations regarding the sprinkler heads.

With much help from several congregants, Spring Clean-up began two-weeks ago in the kitchen and closets. We found several things that were broken or missing parts, and they were, well you guessed it, disposed of. There may be other non-functioning items around and the lower cabinets in the kitchen need attention.

The task now is to complete labeling containers and shelving in the double door storage area to accommodate the needs of the many ministries. The next and continuing task is to maintain the organization of these areas. Drawers, cabinets, and shelves are labeled as to their contents.

Since the available storage space for the kitchen, scullery and closets throughout the Church is at a premium, everyone who uses storage space is asked to check supplies and only order what is needed and not over purchase or overstock. Dot will take inventory after all the reorganizing, relabeling, and consolidating is done so adequate supplies of needed items are available.


