# MARK YOUR CALENDARS FOR THE FALL – DISCIPLE BIBLE STUDY- FAST TRACK is coming to Atlantic UMC!

*Disciple Fast Track*, an adaptation of the original, bestselling *Disciple Bible Study*, provides a viable option for busy people seeking comprehensive engagement over time with the entire biblical text. *Fast Track* groups meet for a total of 24 weeks, devoting 12 weeks each to the Old Testament and the New Testament. Participants read a manageable 3-5 chapters of the Bible daily in

preparation for the weekly meetings, which last approximately 75 minutes. A brief, illustrated review video enables participants to recall important facts and ideas; lively and engaging video presenters then offer insights into the current week's session. Participants have the opportunity to take a spiritual gifts assessment and determine meaningful ways they can serve and live out their discipleship commitment.

#### **Thrift Shop**

It has been a busy month in the Thrift Shop but thanks to our many volunteers we have been able to keep up with donations from many yard sales and condo renovations. Too often I fail to remind everyone that the Thrift Shop is also a very viable mission effort. We routinely give out Bibles (English and Spanish) to customers who ask for them. We also occasionally give free clothing to people who come in and express that need. And daily we give out lots of smiles and encouraging words to our customers. I think many of our volunteers feel the mission aspect of the Thrift Shop is our most important function.

#### Soup Kitchen

The Soup Kitchen has begun to see the influx of international students and the growth in the number of people served each Friday. From the normal 60-70 people we see during the winter months we will soon be seeing upwards of 200-250 people each week. This is a very important mission of this church as many people rely on these daily food locations as their principal meal of the day. We can always use extra help in preparing and serving the meals.

#### **Backpack Ministry**

The Backpack Ministry has been quietly providing weekend food to over thirty students this year. As the school year nears its end I think we need to thank Debbie Priestley and her group of volunteers who collect and pack the backpacks each week. This is an incredibly important project and the beneficiaries are the children.

The Lead Team has done quite a bit of research on Adult Christian Education (by "Adult" we mean 18 years and up). Many Churches are finding a deeper connection to Christ, the Bible, and each other by offering an Adult Christian Education time between services. This would also position us well to offer Sunday School for children during the same time as the church grows in its capacity for ministry.

We would like to explore your thoughts and interest in possibly doing this at AUMC. This program and the weekly sessions will be based on a program called *Faithlink*.
