BELL CHOIR – BILLIE WALL, DIRECTOR



Monthly Report of Trustees Activities and Work Projects Status Month of April 2019

Board of Trustees of Atlantic United Methodist Church reports the following:

Hello all. We appreciate and thank everyone who continues to give us feedback and ideas of repairing and improving our Church building and campus. We appreciate and welcome your ideas and suggestions.

We have entered our long overdue Spring season. We are starting to enjoy some better weather, we are all looking forward to the summer beach and boardwalk time.

The Church grounds have been cleaned up, everything has been pruned, dead plants and bushes removed, flower and plant beds have been edged and mulched. The campus is beautiful and ready for the season.

We ask everyone to help us out by continuing to be vigilant when you are in or around our building. We ask if you see something that should need the attention of the Trustees such as a leaking water source, lights out, broken window(s), equipment or appliances not working, heating or air conditioning not working, or any other concern to please let us know.

The Kitchen and Scullery continues to be a source of our concern and attention. It gets a lot of use, we ask everyone using the kitchen to please be extra attentive to the needs of these 2 areas.

On a positive note, we received a lot of comments and compliments from the county health inspector, vendors and repair people, and congregants on how clean and efficient our kitchen has become. This is due to everyone's cooperation and help. We thank everyone for your continued support with this effort. Were still working on improving the Kitchen and Scullery.

We continue to work very hard to stay on top of the repairs and address everything we can as quickly as we can. As the old saving goes "If You See Something, Say Something".

Since our March report, below is an updated status report of our activities work projects:

Repair of broken window in classroom upstairs:

Broken window needed to be replaced

STATUS: COMPLETED February 18, 2019

Work done by Master Jack Company

Repair to Church Surveillance System:

The current CCTV camera surveillance system needed repair and repositioning of our cameras.

STATUS: COMPLETED February 19, 2019

Work done by ADT at same time of the install of the above alarm upgrade and connectivity project.

Repair of broken Garbage Disposal in Kitchen Scullery:

Broken Garbage Disposal was old, rusted out in the bottom and leaking needed to be replaced.

STATUS: COMPLETED February 22, 2019

Work done by 5 Star Plumbing

Replacement of Knives in Kitchen:

Broken, worn out knives were replaced.

STATUS: COMPLETED February 22, 2019

Work done by Trustees.

Replacement of Soup Server Station in Kitchen:

Broken, would no longer heat. - Needed to be replaced.

STATUS: COMPLETED February 22, 2019

ADT Fire Alarm Upgrade & Connectivity:

ADT Fire Alarm System upgrade throughout Church building to have direct connectivity to Ocean City Emergency Operations Center in the event of a fire event:

Work was supposed to be Completed week of December 3, 2018. They ran into several problems with hardware, building issues and additional requirements by the Fire Marshall's office (Tamper Proof Covers over pull stations, Magnetic door releases, Duct work indicators & monitoring, etc.) during this installation.

STATUS: COMPLETED March 1, 2019

Work Done by ADT.

Replacement of Lock, Handle and key mechanism on Double Door Storage Closet in Hallway:

The lock/handle mechanism to the double door closet was broken beyond repair and needed to be replaced. – Keyed same as previous system.

STATUS: COMPLETED March 1, 2019

Work Done by RJ Locksmith Company.

Handicap Wheel Chair Accessible Entry Button for Glass Entry Doors off Parking Lot:

Installed exterior and interior access buttons for Handicap/Wheelchair access at the double glass entry doors off the parking lot.

These doors will now both open upon activation of the access buttons when the doors are unlocked by the switch inside or the remote button in the office.

STATUS: COMPLETED March 20, 2019

Work to be done by R.J. Locksmith.

Repair the Hymnal, Bible, Pencil, envelope holders, etc. on all Sanctuary Pews:

Several of the larger racks need remounting. They tend to fall off easily. Some smaller pencil/pen racks are either broken or missing. We will be remounting the larger racks to make them stronger and sturdy. We have received the order of the smaller pencil/pen, envelope racks. They have been mounted, this part of this project was completed on Friday March 8, 2019.

STATUS: IN PROGRESS HOPEFULLY TO BE COMPLETED BY END OF MARCH 2019

Work being done by Trustees

Kitchen Pot Replacement:

Replacement of 8 of our 10 of aging aluminum soup/stock pots and lids in the Kitchen with Stainless-Steel pots:

They are much more efficient in heating and heat retention and, less cumbersome.

We are working with different committees within the Church (Martha's Circle, Missions, Soup Kitchen, etc.) to help fund the purchase of these pots.

STATUS: IN PROGRESS HOPEFULLY TO BE COMPLETED IN MARCH 2019

Pull Out Shelves for Kitchen:

Plan to install at least Six (6) more pull out shelves in the Kitchen:

These shelves make working in the kitchen much easier and convenient.

STATUS: IN PROGRESS HOPEFULLY TO BE COMPLETED IN MARCH 2019

Work to be done by Jay Hastings

Windows in the Church Administrator's Office & the Pastor's Office:

Plan to replace the 4 windows in the Church Administrator's office and the Pastor's Office. They are not functional, they will not properly lock and create a security rick and vulnerability to break-in's, they all leak the outside elements of rain, snow, air, heat, and cold to enter and escape.

STATUS: IN PROGRESS HOPEFULLY TO BE COMPLETED IN MARCH 2019

Work being done by Master Jack Company.

Replace the Roofing of the Church Building:

This roof replacement will be to the West end of the Church Building. The roof is very old and has been patched and repaired several times. There has been over \$30,000.00 spent in the past 10 years and the roof still leaks every time we have a large rain or snowfall. We feel the company that had been performing our roof repairs and work (Peninsula Roofing) was not performing a satisfactory job. They were replaced in January of 2019 by (Chesapeake Roofing). We requested bids and found Chesapeake the most reasonable and reliable. Council approved this repair and expense on 2-26-19 at Council Meeting.

STATUS: IN PROGRESS HOPEFULLY TO BE COMPLETED BY END OF APRIL OR

EARLY MAY 2019

Work to be done by Chesapeake Roofing.

NEAR FUTURE/PLANNED PROJECTS & WORK – SHORT TERM:

Kitchen Spice Rack:

Plan to purchase and install a larger more efficient Spice Rack in the Kitchen.

STATUS: PENDING Work to be done in 2019 After Kitchen Painting and Reorganization

To be purchased and installed by Trustees

This rack will hold all our essential spices and be much easier to access It also keeps us in Health Department compliance by keeping them up off the counter shelves where they are currently. This is another step making working in the kitchen much easier, and convenient.

Church Wide Work Day/Clean-Up, Fix Up - SPRING:

The Church campus has needed a through cleanup/fixup for a long time. We plan on starting on the lower level in the Spring. We are hopeful we will have enough volunteers to get everything done within a couple of days.

Plan to do a complete cleanup, and painting of the Kitchen Cabinets and storage spaces in the Kitchen and Scullery. This will be done in coordination with our planned Spring Cleanup/Fixup days in the spring of the year.

STATUS: PENDING Work to be done in Spring 2019 by way of Church Wide Workday to be held Saturday May 18, 2019 from 9:00 a.m. – 4:00 p.m.

The Church campus has needed a through cleanup/fixup for a long time. We plan on finishing on the upper level in the Fall. We are hopeful we will have enough volunteers to get everything done within a couple of days.

Plan to do a complete cleanup, painting (as needed), and fixup. Of the meeting/classrooms on the upper level. This will be done in coordination with our planned Fall Cleanup/Fixup days in the Fall of the year.

EXTENDED - FUTURE/PLANNED PROJECTS & WORK - LONG TERM:

Plan to renovate and remodel our Kitchen to make it more functional and user friendly:

This will include the purchase of an additional standup commercial refrigerator to be placed in the kitchen if possible, and the replacement of the two current older residential rated refrigerators that are currently located in the scullery. These units are very old and not compliant with use in our commercial kitchen.

STATUS: PENDING 2020 if possible

To be included in the 2020 budget requests and if funds are available and approved, we would like to proceed early in the year, perhaps January or 2020. We are working in coordination with professionals diligently on this project. We will keep everyone posted on the status of this project.

PLEASE TAKE NOTE: WE RECEIVED OUR ANNUAL HEALTH DEPARTMENT INSPECTION ON OUR KITCHEN FACILITIES ON TUESDAY JANUARY 15, 2019. – WE HAVE BEEN ORDERED TO GET THE REFRIGERATION UNIT UNDER THE WORK COUNTER FIXED ASAP BEFORE USEAGE AND TO REPLACE THE NON-COMMERCIAL GRADE REFRIGERATORS CURRENTLY IN THE SCULLERY REPLACED ASAP. – THEY ARE NOT COMPLIANT TO A COMMERCIAL KITCHN OPERATION.

Plan to reduce the size of 4 pews in the Sanctuary to accommodate space for 4 Wheelchairs:

This will include the reduction in size on 4 pews in the Sanctuary it will occur on 2 pews in the far rear of the sanctuary 1 on each side and 2 pews, 1 on each side approximately $\frac{1}{2}$ way in the center of the sanctuary. This will require a carpenter to cut them down and reattach the end caps.

STATUS: PENDING 2020 if possible

To be included in the 2020 budget requests and if funds are available and approved, we would like to proceed early in the year, perhaps January or 2020. We are working in coordination with professionals diligently on this project. We will keep everyone posted on the status of this project.

<u>Plan to have all brick work on the Church building tipped (cleared and filled), and the cracks in all the exterior walls repaired.:</u>

This will include all exterior brick and stucco walls. They currently have several cracks in the walls and causes rain, snow, etc. to leak in the walls and building.

STATUS: PENDING 2020 if possible

To be included in the 2020 budget requests and if funds are available and approved, we would like to proceed early in the year, perhaps January or 2020. We are working in coordination with professionals diligently on this project. We will keep everyone posted on the status of this project.

<u>Plan to paint the Kitchen walls and cabinets, Scullery, and Tilghman Hall walls:</u>

This will include the painting of the walls in the kitchen, cabinets in the kitchen, walls in the scullery, and walls in Tilghman Hall.

STATUS: PENDING 2020 if possible

To be included in the 2020 budget requests and if funds are available and approved, we would like to proceed early in the year, perhaps January or 2020. We are working in coordination with professionals diligently on this project. We will keep everyone posted on the status of this project.
