MESSAGE FROM PASTOR JOE

How Much Should I Tip?

The other day I went out to lunch with my daughter, Rebekah, and at the end of the meal I asked her, "How much should I give for the tip?" You see, before teaching, Rebekah used to work as a waitress in several restaurants. She told me and I paid the bill and the tip. I also ask her because one day we went to lunch, and, I left an improper amount. Dad (me) heard about it!

In preparing for Sunday message one August 25th, I researched all kinds of web-sites and articles on service. I also found an interesting article on, "how to be a good customer"! And, Rule #40 was "If you can't afford to leave a tip, you can't afford to eat in the restaurant. Stay home." I love that rule! I think that rule should be applied to every area of life, and, this rule must include more than generosity!

In the Letter to the Colossians, the Apostle Paul, tells the church:

Colossians 3:12-13¹² Since God chose you to be the holy people he loves, you must clothe yourselves with tenderhearted mercy, kindness, humility, gentleness, and patience. ¹³ Make allowance for each other's faults, and forgive anyone who offends you. Remember, the Lord forgave you, so you must forgive others. (NLT)

Kindness and generosity (forgiveness) along with mercy (compassion), humility, gentleness and patience are just like items of clothing – you must put them on! "Imagine a new rule of life: if you can't afford to be kind – stay home!" "If you can't be patient with people – stay home!"

Notice the items we must put on when we venture out the front door:

 Mercy or compassion – since we have been given mercy, give it liberally to all who need mercy; 2) Kindness – a disposition of courtesy to all, to build better relationships & friendships;
Humility – to those who are over us and no condescension to those who are below us. In this passage, humility isn't just a humble demeanor or attitude, it is a humble mindset. 4) Gentleness or meekness – this is directed to those who have injured us. Resentment and revenge are not in our vocabulary; 5) Patience – is a quality of Godly character for those who provoke us.

How much should I tip? Well, right there it is! 100% of kindness, generosity, forgiveness, compassion, humility, gentleness and patience. This is how God tipped us, and how we should tip others.

Monthly Report of Trustees Activities and Work Projects Status Month of September 2019 Board of Trustees of Atlantic United Methodist Church reports the following:

Hello all. We appreciate and thank everyone who continues to give us feedback and ideas of repairing and improving our Church building and campus. We appreciate and welcome your ideas and suggestions.

We ask everyone to help us out by continuing to be vigilant when you are in or around our building. We ask if you see something that needs the attention of the Trustees such as a leaking water source, lights out, broken window(s), equipment or appliances not working, heating or air conditioning not working, or any other concern to please let us know.

<u>Church Building Security:</u> There have been a few occasions lately where we have found the Church building unsecure. This is a large concern for our safety and security.

This is a both a concern during the week and on Sunday's for our Church Services.

If you are using the Church, or the last one to leave after an event or meeting, please make sure the Building is locked, and secure.

We have asked the weekly ushers, greeters and any trustee members that may be in church to please coordinate and make sure that the Church building is completely locked before leaving.

If you unlock or open a door, please close it and relock it after you're done. Please Do not prop open any doors with wedges.

Church Building HVAC:

There have been several incidents lately that we have found the HVAC Thermostats adjusted below or above our normal settings. This causes several problems, particularly when the building is vacant;

It overworks our systems.

It increases our HVAC Bill dramatically.

It makes the building spaces uncomfortable when the building is opened.

We kindly ask all users that if you adjust the thermostat for a meeting, function, or service that you return it to its originally set reading of 72 degrees in Summer and during the winter 60 degrees.

PARKING LOT ISSUES:

<u>Update Parking Signs in Parking Lot to Accommodate Enforcement and Towing of</u> <u>Violators:</u>

Our parking lot continues to be an area of concern. It has gotten better, but there are still some persons using it without conducting Church business or attending services.

Remember, to avoid your vehicle from being towed, we want to once again remind congregants that our policy is for all to display a recent AUMC Church Bulletin on the dash of your vehicle.

We continue to work very hard to stay on top of the repairs and address everything we can as quickly as we can. As the old saying goes "If You See Something, Say Something".

Since our last report, below is an updated status report of our activities work projects:

Broken Camera & Replacement of the Camera Surveillance System:

Mid July we experienced a broken camera in our surveillance system. It was replaced.ADT advised us the system is outdated, parts are no longer available for repair.Recommendation to replace the entire camera system consisting of 12 cameras andrecording devices in the Church and Thrift shop. This proposal was brought before theChurch Council for approval on 7-30-19. It was approved.STATUS:COMPLETEDAugust 5, 2019

Access Cover for front of AV Console System:

There was a concern that the wires and components to the AV Console were exposed and subject to damage. We installed a removable cover on the front of the AV Console system to eliminate this problem.

Church Wide Work Day/Clean-Up, Fix Up - FALL:

The Church campus has needed a through cleanup/fixup for a long time. We plan on finishing on the upper level in the Fall. We are hopeful we will have enough volunteers to get everything done within a couple of days.

Plan to do a complete cleanup, painting (as needed), and fixup. Of the meeting/classrooms on the upper level. This will be done in coordination with our planned Fall Cleanup/Fixup days in the Fall of the year.
