Love God with All You've Got!!

Matthew 22:34-46 ³⁴ But when the Pharisees heard that he had silenced the Sadducees with his reply, they met together to question him again. ³⁵ One of them, an expert in religious law, tried to trap him with this question: ³⁶ "Teacher, which is the most important commandment in the law of Moses?" ³⁷ Jesus replied, "You must love the Lord your God with all your heart, all your soul, and all your mind.' ³⁸ This is the first and greatest commandment. ³⁹ A second is equally important: 'Love your neighbor as yourself.' ⁴⁰ The entire law and all the demands of the prophets are based on these two commandments." ⁴¹ Then, surrounded by the Pharisees, Jesus asked them a question: ⁴² "What do you think about the Messiah? Whose son is he?" They replied, "He is the son of David." ⁴³ Jesus responded, "Then why does David, speaking under the inspiration of the Spirit, call the Messiah 'my Lord?' For David said, ⁴⁴ 'The Lord said to my Lord, Sit in the place of honor at my right hand until I humble your enemies beneath your feet.' ⁴⁵ Since David called the Messiah 'my Lord,' how can the Messiah be his son?" ⁴⁶ No one could answer him. And after that, no one dared to ask him any more questions.

Matthew 22:36 Teacher, which is the most important commandment in the law of Moses?

Deuteronomy 6:5 And you must love the LORD your God with all your heart, all your soul, and all your strength. (NLT)

Matthew 22:40 The entire law and all the demands of the prophets are based on these two commandments. (NLT) On these two commandments **depend** the whole Law and the Prophets. (NAS) All the Law and the Prophets **hang on** these two commandments. (NIV)

Jesus Raises the Bar!!

Matthew 22:39 The second is like it...

Matthew 7:12 Do to others whatever you would like them to do to you. This is the essence of all that is taught in the law and the prophets. (NLT)

Matthew 7:11 So if you sinful people know how to give good gifts to your children, how much more will your heavenly Father give good gifts to those who ask him. (NLT)

Romans 13:8–10 ⁸ Owe nothing to anyone—except for your obligation to love one another. If you love your neighbor, you will **fulfill the requirements of God's law**. ⁹ For the commandments say, "You must not commit adultery. You must not murder. You must not steal. You must not covet." These—and other such commandments—are summed up in this one commandment: "Love your neighbor as yourself." ¹⁰ Love does no wrong to others, so love **fulfills the requirements of God's law**. (NLT)
