Experiencing God's Love

The whole of the Christian life is to "experience God's love." It isn't enough to believe or even know God loves you, but to experience it. Recently, I read Paul's letter to the Ephesians, where he instructs them with these words:

Ephesians 3:16-19 "out of his glorious riches may [God] strengthen you with power through his Spirit in your inner being, so that Christ may dwell in your hearts through faith. And I pray that you, being rooted and established in love, may have power, together with all God's holy people, to grasp how wide and long and high and deep is the love of Christ, and to know this love that surpasses knowledge—that you may be filled to the measure of all the fullness of God" (Eph. 3:16-19).

If it didn't hit you the first time, just like the first time I read this verse, that's okay. What Paul tells these believers is that the power for Christian living comes to us when we are grounded and growing in the love of God!

We know that John tells us that one true characteristic of God is this eternal aspect of love ("God is Love") and Paul tells us that all things will pass away but three things will last for all eternity and love is the most enduring of all three ("faith, hope, and love—and the greatest of these is love.")

The reason why love is the chief attribute of God and love is the greatest for all eternity, is because to experience God's love is the ultimate act of healing.

Here's the thing about healing, whether it is physical, emotional, or spiritual. Before you can experience healing, you must be willing to: 1) name and identify your hurts, and 2) be willing to move one from your hurts.


First, the ability to name and identity your hurts is the process of diagnosis. Before we can mend, we must first name what's broken. If we are hurt physically, we go to a doctor; emotionally, we go to a counselor. For many of us, we don't know what is really bothering us, or even hurting us. The best way to discover this is: on one side of a piece paper, write down any of the hurts you feel because of this past year. It could be sadness about missing games, concerts, and time with friends. It could be frustration with having to do so many things virtually. It could be anger at situations that aren't fair for yourself or others.

Second, are you ready to move on from your hurts? I am. But, if I try and erase all the hurts, the eraser marks are still there! If I rip up the paper, the hurts are still seen on every little piece. No matter what, the hurts are still there! So, what do we do? We take colored pencils or paint and draw a picture or write down words over the top of the hurts! Write an encouraging note to yourself or someone else who is experiencing the hurts you have experienced. Instead of the words, 'lost my job', write the out Romans 8:28 over the top of the hurt.

You will then realize what I have come to learn, the hurt still exists but the new images or

words outshine the hurts, or pain.

This is exactly what the Apostle Peter meant when we wrote these words to the whole church: "1 Peter 4:8 Most important of all, continue to show deep love for each other, for love covers a multitude of sins." Yes, the word sins is used here, but what are 'sins' except, the hurt and pain we have caused others and God, and the hurts that have affected us!




The love of God transforms you!

Even though were still challenged with the Covid restrictions and safety protocols, we continue to meet, worship, keep our ministries up and running, and serve God.

We require everyone to still WEAR MASKS and PRACTICE SOCIAL DISTANCING

We continue under the guidelines and directives set forth by the Federal Government, CDC, State of Maryland, Worcester County, and Town of Ocean City, and our Conference leadership and Bishop. Protective face coverings and social distancing is still required. The following are the latest AUMC COVID 19 procedures and protocols developed and approved by AUMC SAFE Team on 1-21-21. Please read them carefully. If you have any questions, feel free to contact Trustee Chair Larry Yates or Pastor Joe Barth

ATLANTIC UMC COVID-19 GUIDELINES

We continue to fight the Covid-19 virus and are diligent to keep all safe! We need everyone's help to make our facilities as safe as possible:

- You must immediately notify the church office or Pastor Barth (after church office hours) if are exhibiting any symptoms. and/or, have been in contact with someone who may be infected or who tested positive.
- If you are sick, do not come on the Church campus.
- If you have any symptoms, you may get a Covid-19 test after 5 days of being exposed and continue to quarantine for 7 days. Or, quarantine for 14 days.
- If you have been in close contact with someone who tested positive, quarantine for 14 days whether or not you have symptoms.

• If you test positive and have no symptoms, you still must quarantine for 14 days from exposure.

The church facilities are still officially closed during normal business hours. The church administrator and pastor have returned to their full-time office hours. There is still limited/restricted admission to the building. There is still no use of our church facility by outside groups. The thrift shop is operating with increased safety protocols.

THINGS NEEDING TRUSTEE ATTENTION:

We need everyone's' help please. There have been occasions lately that there have been unreported problems in the Church building and on campus found that require attention for repair and replacement. Particularly issues involving leaks and electrical problems. These are considered emergencies and could, if left unattended cause costly, and catastrophic consequences to our building and campus.

PLEASE, IF YOU SEE SOMETHING NOTIFY US IMMEDIATELY. PLEASE DON'T ASSUME THAT SOMEONE ELSE HAS OR WILL NOTIFY US. THIS IS VERY IMPORTANT.

If you need to contact us or bring something to our attention. We prefer everything to be documented in writing so Please correspond by email or text to both Larry Yates and Bob Eastman. We will take care of the need from there. We ask that you not attempt to do repairs yourself, contact vendors, or non-vendors for repairs.

HVAC & UTILITIES:

We still need your help with our Church Building HVAC & UTILITIES:

HVAC is always an issue, and since our building is closed most of the time, we must conserve energy and watch our utilities.

Please help us and turn off the lights when you are done using them.

We ask everyone to please avoid changing or adjusting the readings on the thermostats and observe the settings on all thermostats of 74 in the summer and 67 in the winter.

We understand there may be times that you have to adjust the thermostats or turn on lights when you are in the building and using them, but If you must change the settings or turn on lights please return them to the original settings and turn off the lights. The bills for HVAC and electric can be exceedingly high and this would be helpful. Thank You.

REPAIRS:

Replacement of coach lights at 4th Street Entrance:

There was a need for replacing the old coach lights at the 4th street entrance. The fixtures were not working and rusted making replacing light bulbs impossible.

STATUS: COMPLETED February 15, 2021

Work done by Royal Plus Electric.

GRANT:

We have applied for a grant through the Town of OC, and the OCDC to add security lighting to the outside of the Church building. This will not be any cost to the Church, and it will make the Church safer. I will keep you posted on the progress of this program.

ALTAR GUILD - BECKY YATES

February was a busy time for The Altar Guild preparing for Ash Wednesday services and the upcoming Easter Season.

In the Christian year of our church, we recognize two cycles: the Christmas Cycle (Advent-Christmas-Epiphany) and the Easter Cycle (Lent-Easter-Pentecost). Within each cycle are a preparatory season symbolized by purple and a festival season symbolized by the color white. Between each cycle follows an ordinary time of growth symbolized by green in the Seasons after the Epiphany and after Pentecost. Therefore, there is a sequence of seasons using purple, white, and green in that order twice each year.

From February 17, 2021 (Ash Wednesday) through April 4, 2021 (Easter Sunday), the Altar Guild will transform the Altar, Sanctuary and Narthex for this season in the life of the Church.

PURPLE is a color of both penitence and royalty used during the preparatory season and Lent. February 17 through April 1, 2021.

BLACK is a color of death used on Good Friday and Holy Saturday, April 2 and 3, 2021.

WHITE and/or GOLD are joyous and festive colors used during the Easter seasons, April 4 through May 16, 2021.

March 7, 2021 – Communion Sunday

March 28, 2021 – Palm Sunday

April 1, 2021 – Maundy Thursday

April 2, 2021 – Good Friday

April 4, 2021 – Easter Sunday

Information will be placed in the bulletin regarding the purchase of spring flowers for display on the Altar during the Easter Season.
