Effective July 1, 2021, Atlantic United Methodist Church will be a part of the Lower Shore District of the Peninsula-Delaware Conference. Rev. Tina Blake will be the District Superintendent. This is a result of the Annual Conference action to reduce the conference from four districts to three districts. The district office will remain in Salisbury.

Effective September 1, 2021, the Peninsula-Delaware Conference will be aligned (not merged) with the Baltimore-Washington Conference. Bishop LaTrelle Easterling will be the presiding bishop for both of these conferences. This realignment is necessary since several bishops in the Northeast Jurisdiction are retiring including our current Bishop Peggy Johnson.

The Peninsula-Delaware Annual Conference will be held as a virtual conference from June 10-12, 2021. The Northeastern Jurisdictional Conference will be a virtual meeting held July 20-23, 2021.

The United Methodist General Conference for Minneapolis, MN has again been postponed until August 29 – September 6, 2022.

Monthly Report of Trustees Activities and Work Projects Status Month of May 2021

Board of Trustees of Atlantic United Methodist Church reports the following: Even though we continue to be challenged with the Covid restrictions and safety protocols, we continue to meet, worship, keep our ministries up and running, and serve God.

<u>We require everyone to still WEAR MASKS and PRACTICE SOCIAL</u> <u>DISTANCING. –</u>

We continue under the guidelines and directives set forth by the Federal Government, CDC, State of Maryland, Worcester County, and Town of Ocean City, and our Conference leadership and Bishop. Protective face coverings and social distancing is still required.

The following are the latest AUMC COVID 19 procedures and protocols developed and approved by AUMC SAFE Team on 1-21-21. Please read them carefully. If

ATLANTIC UMC COVID-19 GUIDELINES

We continue to fight the Covid-19 virus and are diligent to keep all safe! We need everyone's help to make our facilities as safe as possible:

- You must immediately notify the church office or Pastor Barth (after church office hours) if are exhibiting any symptoms. and/or, have been in contact with someone who may be infected or who tested positive.
- If you are sick, do not come on the Church campus.
- If you have any symptoms, you may get a Covid-19 test after 5 days of being exposed and continue to quarantine for 7 days. Or, quarantine for 14 days.
- If you have been in close contact with someone who tested positive, quarantine for 14 days whether or not you have symptoms.
- If you test positive and have no symptoms, you still must quarantine for 14 days from exposure.

The church facilities are still officially closed during normal business hours. The church administrator and pastor have returned to their full-time office hours. There is still limited/restricted admission to the building. There is still no use of our church facility by outside groups. The thrift shop is operating with increased safety protocols.

There have been no changes in safety and operational protocols, there will be no changes until the Federal Government, CDC, State of Maryland, County of Worcester and Town of Ocean City approves them.

We need everyone's' help please. There continues to be unreported problems in the Church building and on campus found that require attention for repair and replacement. Particularly issues involving leaks and electrical problems. These are considered emergencies and could, if left unattended cause costly, and catastrophic consequences to our building and campus. <u>PLEASE, IF YOU SEE SOMETHING NOTIFIY US</u> <u>IMMEDIATELY. HVAC & UTILITIES:

We still need your help with our Church Building HVAC & UTILITIES:

HVAC is always an issue, and since our building is closed most of the time, we must conserve energy and watch our utilities.

Please help us and turn off the lights when you are done using them.

We ask everyone to please avoid changing or adjusting the readings on the thermostats and observe the settings on all thermostats of 74 in the summer and 67 in the winter. We understand there may be times that you have to adjust the thermostats or turn on lights when you are in the building and using them, but If you must change the settings or turn on lights, please return them to the original settings and turn off the lights. <u>The bills</u> for HVAC and electric can be exceedingly high and this would be helpful. Thank You.

PARKING/USE OF CHURCH PARKING FACILITIES:

Spring/Summer/Tourist season has arrived and with that comes parking issues and concerns. Improper use of our Church Parking lot continues to be an issue. We have had illegally parked vehicles towed from our lot recently, and we will continue to monitor the lot and tow illegally parked vehicles. The tow fee is \$450.00. PLEASE REMEMBER: When you use our parking lot, please display either a Church bulletin when available, or a AUMC Congregant parking pass (these look just like the cover of a bulletin but says "AUMC congregant parking – 2021"

Broken Refrigerator in Kitchen: Refrigerator quit working, was not cooling. - Blowing hot air. The Compressor required replacing. **STATUS:** COMPLETED April 12, 2021 Work done by McDonald Refrigeration. Broken Dishwasher in Scullery: Dishwasher rinse operating system quit working, was not rinsing. COMPLETED **STATUS:** April 12, 2021

ALTAR GUILD – BECKY YATES

On Pentecost Sunday, we remember the day the disciples received the Holy Spirit in a special way. The story in <u>Acts 2</u> describes a powerful wind and tongues of fire as the Holy Spirit was poured out on people from all over the world who came to Jerusalem to celebrate a Jewish feast. At the first Pentecost over 3000 people were baptized, creating the first church. This is why Pentecost is known as the <u>birthday of the Christian church</u>.

The word <u>Pentecost</u> comes from a Greek word meaning fiftieth. The Jewish Festival of Pentecost (called *Shavuot*, meaning "weeks" in Hebrew) falls on the fiftieth day after the original Passover. On that day, God gave the Torah to Moses on Mount Sinai. The Christian festival of Pentecost falls on the 50th day after the resurrection of Jesus.

Pentecost for Christians culminates the celebration and work of the church begun on Easter Day. In early Christianity, Easter Day was the primary day for baptisms. The newly baptized were then trained in basic Christian doctrine, including the meaning of the sacraments they had now experienced, as they prepared to take up their ministries in the life of the church. On Pentecost, Christians celebrate the <u>commissioning of new</u> <u>members into ministry</u>.

Two colors are historically associated with Pentecost. Red is a visual reminder of the "tongues of fire" that empowered the apostles and others to proclaim the good news of Christ's resurrection in many languages to the crowds of pilgrims from many lands (Acts 2:3).

White is also used because Pentecost was the major day for baptisms in the early church. Those being baptized were given new white robes to wear as a sign they had taken off the world, died to sin, and were raised with the risen Christ to new life. This is why Pentecost may be referred to as "Whitsunday" or "White Sunday."

The <u>Season after Pentecost</u> is the time of the church year to support new disciples and the whole congregation in living out the gifts we have been given in the name of Jesus and the power of the Holy Spirit.

The new plans included the Thrift Shop, four classrooms, the 2 large restrooms on the second floor and enlarged the choir room. Joseph Dashields was awarded the contract at a cost





of \$550,000 which was paid off before George left. We "old folks' were sad to see the parsonage go; the nursery and toddler class was held on the first floor in the early days and in the later 60's it was used as a Thrift Shop! We were all sad to see George and Vera go. We tried to appeal Bishop Weaver's decision, but we could not change his mind. So, they were assigned to Trinity United Methodist in Salisbury, where he served until his

retirement in 2018. We are so please that they are worshipping with us again, and thank them for their long and dedicated ministry.
