We are asking all Trustee members to help us during the Sunday morning services, or if you are attending a special function or service. Each of us should coordinate with other Trustees in attendance, but it does not hurt for each of us to be aware and help with the following:

## When you arrive at Church:

- Please make sure the doors are unlocked and are ready to welcome everyone.
- Please make sure the lights are turned on in the Hallways, Sanctuary, bathrooms, Tilghman Hall, etc.
- Please adjust the thermostats in the Sanctuary and or Social Hall for comfort.
- Please help by monitoring the hallways and doorways ensuring the safety and security of our building and congregants.
- Please help when needed to fill in or help compliment the ushers and greeters.

## Before leaving Church:

- Please make sure all lights are turned off
- Please make sure the Thermostats are returned to the at rest temperature of 74 in the Summer and 68 in the winter.
- Please make sure all doors are locked.
- Please make sure the appliances such as coffee maker, etc. are turned off and we have no leaking water or sparking electric things.

You will see below, we continue to be busy taking care of a lot of electrical, plumbing, and HVAC issues and problems along with small repairs, and storage issues. ## SAFETY, SECURITY & BUILDING USE:

The 2021-22 Emergency Preparedness & Church Facilities Use Policies Manual has been updated to reflect current information, they have been placed in all the normal locations throughout our Church Buildings.

#### **HVAC & UTILITIES:**

We still need your help with our Church Building HVAC & UTILITIES: HVAC is always an issue.

We must conserve energy and watch our utilities. Please help us and turn off the lights when you are done using them. We ask everyone to please avoid changing or adjusting the readings on the thermostats and observe the settings on all thermostats of 74 in the summer and 68 in the winter.

We understand there may be times that you have to adjust the thermostats or turn on lights when you are in the building and using them, but If you must change the settings or turn on lights, please return them to the original settings and turn off the lights. The bills for HVAC and electric can be exceedingly high and this would be helpful. Thank You.

## PARKING/USE OF CHURCH PARKING FACILITIES:

Spring/Summer/Tourist season has arrived and with that comes parking issues and concerns. Improper use of our Church Parking lot continues to be an issue. We have had illegally parked vehicles towed from our lot recently, and we will continue to monitor the lot and tow illegally parked vehicles. The tow fee is \$450.00. PLEASE REMEMBER: When you use our parking lot, please display an AUMC Congregant Parking Pass (these look just like the cover of a bulletin but says "AUMC congregant parking – 2021" We have had these passes printed and they are available from the office. If you would like one, please contact the office and Dot will make sure you get one. YOU MAY ALSO USE THE CITY HALL PARKING LOT AND THE MUNICIPAL LOT ON 4<sup>TH</sup> STREET FREE OF CHARGE UNTIL 12 NOON ON SUNDAYS.

#### ALTAR/WORSHIP - BECKY YATES

On August 1, 2021, we welcome Pastor George Patterson to the pulpit. With Pastor Patterson leading us in worship, the congregation will notice some changes in procedure during the 10:00 AM traditional service. The Altar Guild and Worship Committee are ready to assist the Pastor in implementing these changes.

Members of the congregation are encouraged to get involved with Greeting and Ushering on Sunday mornings. This is a terrific way to get to know current members, former members and new members attending AUMC.

A church greeter and usher are sometimes interchangeable. They are the first and last person people see when visiting a church. The church's greeter and/or usher is the face of any ministry, which makes it one of the most important jobs in the church.

The greeter and/or usher welcomes regular members and visitors with a smile, hug (as appropriate) or handshake as they arrive in the doors.

Greeters give visitors any welcome gifts the church may be distributing. They may also give them fliers and brochures for church ministries they may be interested in joining.

Church greeters should be able to direct the flow of traffic inside the church. Newcomers will need to know where restrooms and other facilities are located.

Church greeters should open doors for incoming members and visitors. At the end of the service, they should open doors again to allow churchgoers to leave with a hug (as appropriate) handshake or goodbye.

Ushers have a role separate but connected to greeters. Before the church service starts, the ushers will often have the responsibility to check the thermostat, check the restrooms, and prepare the bulletins for distribution. As churchgoers arrive, the ushers will act as doorkeepers, greeting each person with a smile, shaking hands, and handing out bulletins. They are also available to answer visitors' questions and extend extra help in seating those who need assistance.

During the church service, the ushers usually take part in some way. They are responsible to take up the church offering and make sure it is put in the proper place. In some churches, ushers also help with the Lord's Supper or Communion as the Pastor requires. Ushers have a goal of minimizing distractions during the music and sermon. Ushers stand ready to assist anyone in the congregation who might need help, to aid latecomers in finding a seat, and to inform those in the sanctuary of any urgent matters.

Church ushers, in case of an emergency, will take the lead in getting people to safety in an orderly manner.

After the service, ushers will again be at the door to greet the congregation as they leave and assist as needed. In many churches, the ushers will then make sure that the sanctuary is tidy, the thermostat is adjusted, and the lights are shut off.

Currently volunteers are asked to sign up on the sheets outside the Sanctuary. Please take a moment to see if there is a Sunday each month you will be able and willing to volunteer for either of these very important positions as we move into the next season at AUMC. If you are not familiar with the responsibilities of the positions, training will be provided either in a group or individually. Sunday morning observance is the best teacher.

Regardless of greeting or ushering on Sunday mornings, we are all unofficial greeters and ushers for God.
