#### FROM THE LAY REPRESENTATIVE/LAY LEADER (ROBERT JOHNSON)

The 238<sup>th</sup> Session of the Peninsula-Delaware Conference was held June 16-18, 2022 via Zoom. Separate clergy and laity sessions were held on June 16<sup>th</sup>. A combined session was held June 17<sup>th</sup>.

Three procedural resolutions regarding the rules of conduct of the sessions and the calendar were passed. Several normal annual housekeeping resolutions were passed dealing with pastor minimum salaries, retired clergy housing allowance, pre-1982 service rates, and clergy and lay employee eligibility for benefits. A lengthy motion regarding the representation of the annual conference was referred to the session committee and will likely be taken up at the next Annual Conference.

The Jurisdictional Conferences are scheduled for November at which time new bishops could be elected. The Peninsula-Delaware Conference elected not to present any potential nominees.

The Annual Conference created a new conference level committee on Creation Care/Creation Justice.

The annual conference budget was passed and key summary figures are shown below.

Five churches in the conference have voted to disaffiliate with the United Methodist Church in accordance with the Taylor Disaffiliation Plan and all were approved pending compliance with the total agreements. They are: Woodland UMC, Seaford, DE; Taylorsville UMC, Berlin, MD; Calvary UMC, Smith Island, MD; Elwell UMC, Smith Island, MD; and Union UMC, Smith Island, MD.

Although the bankruptcy court has not yet confirmed it, there has been an agreement between the United Methodist Church and the Boy Scouts of America. In the future, there will be standardized agreement regarding sponsorship, responsibilities, risk, and insurance. As a note, AUMC has not sponsored any BSA troops and, therefore, has not been directly affected.
