The name Micah isn't exactly a marquis Biblical name. Though obscure, this ancient prophet really had a spirit of discernment. Micah had a deep suspicion that something phony was going on. He sensed that there was greed in the hearts of the leaders of the kingdom of Judah, which prompted him to warn the common folk not to be deceived by religious leaders of that day.

The Rev. Charles Swidoll writes; "in true prophetic style, Micah comforted the afflicted and afflicted the comfortable." Micah publicly condemned sin. He fought for the well being of the oppressed. He tried to warn the people that the future of the nation was in jeopardy. In doing so he risked his own life.

But Micah didn't focus on the negative, but on the positive. He offered wisdom, hope, and grace to God's people. This prophet of God saved his best words for a positive message to the people. He writes; "With what shall I come to the LORD and bow myself before the God on high? Shall I come to Him with burnt offerings, with yearling calves? Does the LORD take delight in thousands of rams, in ten thousand rivers of oil? Shall I present my firstborn for my rebellious acts, the fruit of my body for the sin of my soul?" (Micah. 6:6-7). No! That is not what God desires from His people.

Micah had the spiritual insight to know what pleased God. He writes: "God has told you, O man, what is good; and what does the LORD require of you but to do justice, to love kindness, and to walk humbly with your God?" (Micah. 6:8).
