Stop and ponder this:

- ➢ If you have never experienced the danger of battle, and the loneliness of imprisonment, or the pangs of starvation, you were more blessed than over 500 million people in the world.

- If you have food in your refrigerator, and your pantry is stocked, clothes on your back, a roof over your head, and a place to sleep, you are richer than 75% of the world.
- If you have money in the bank, money in your wallet or purse, you or among the top 8% of the world's wealthy.

We have so much for which to be thankful. How can we look at the magnificence of a sunrise or sunset and not feel the surge of gratitude? How can we look at the heavens sprinkled with stars, highlighted by a beautiful moon, and not feel the surge of gratitude? How can we look into the eyes of our spouses, children, families, and friends and not feel a surge of gratitude? How can we draw a breath, lift a hand, take a step, savor a meal, speak a word and not feel the surge of gratitude and thanksgiving? How can we walk into the Church, sing the great hymns, listen to the anthems sung, hear the holy and sacred Word read, and be reminded of God's redemptive and reconciling work in Jesus Christ and not feel the surge of gratitude and thanksgiving? How can we kneel at the communion rail, receiving the bread and the juice, symbolic of Christ broken body and shed blood and not feel the surge of gratitude and thanksgiving? Indeed, we have much for which to be grateful.


